Unpacking

1. Remove dehumidifier from carton.
2. Remove any protective packaging applied to dehumidifier for shipment.
3. Check for loose or missing parts. Check for shipping damage. If any parts are missing or damaged, promptly contact the dealer for additional instructions.
4. A piece of tape is attached to the condensate container to ensure safe shipping. This piece of tape may be removed.



General Safety Information

▲ CAUTION *Before you use your dehumidifier, please read this instruction manual carefully.*

FUNCTIONS

- Helps prevent mold on clothing, etc.
Open cupboards, doors and drawers before turning the dehumidifier on.
- Helps prevent condensation on ceilings, walls, and glazing. To obtain best results, refrain from opening and closing the windows.
- Dehumidifying is effective on moisture-sensitive items like musical instruments, cameras, computers, etc.
- Takes away the dampness from bookshelves and closets. Open the door of the closet and put the dehumidifier close to the door for it to operate effectively.

SAFETY NOTES

- Do not connect unit to any AC electrical outlet that is damaged.
- Ensure removable covers and containers are correctly fitted before switching on unit.
- Always switch off the unit before unplugging.
- Do not use in the following locations:
 - Next to source of heat e.g. a radiator or heater, tumble dryer etc.
 - An area where oil or water is likely to splash.
 - An area exposed to direct sunlight.
 - Near a bath, shower or a swimming pool.
 - In a greenhouse.
- Never insert your finger or other foreign objects into grills or openings. Take special care to warn children of these dangers.
- Always store the unit upright in order to maintain the compressor in a proper working condition. Leave the unit upright for at least 24 hours before operating.
- Always unplug the unit before cleaning.
- Do not cover the unit.
- Do not spray insecticides or any other flammable sprays on the machine.
- Do not spray water on the dehumidifier.
- There are no user-serviceable parts. Should the unit or power cord of this appliance become damaged, the unit must be returned to the manufacturer or service agent.
- Empty the water tank before moving the dehumidifier.
- Models 5EAJ7, 5EAJ8 and 5EAJ9 are fitted with an auto defrosting operation that starts when the evaporator generates frost. This function ensures continuous running when the temperature is 55°F (13°C).

▲ WARNING **ELECTRICAL SHOCK HAZARD**

Plug unit only into grounded electrical outlet.

Do not use an extension cord or plug adaptor with this unit.

Do not operate unit with filter removed.



Failure to follow the above precautions could result in electrical shock, fire or personal injury.

The unit may be on a fuse or circuit breaker with other devices. However, the maximum amp draw of all devices on that fuse or circuit breaker cannot exceed the ampacity of the fuse or circuit breaker.

▲ WARNING *Do not operate this dehumidifier without proper time delay circuit protection. Refer to serial plate for proper power supply requirements.*

▲ WARNING *Do not store or use gasoline or other flammable vapors and liquids in the vicinity of this or any other appliance. The fumes can create a fire hazard or explosion.*

IMPORTANT GROUNDING REQUIREMENTS

Your dehumidifier will operate on any 115 volt, 3-pronged (grounded), 60 Hz circuit. A separate line is not required, but it is advisable not to overload the circuit with heavy duty appliances such as washing machines, etc. For your safety, this dehumidifier is equipped with a 3-pronged, grounding plug and must be plugged into a properly grounded outlet. If your outlet is not of the proper type, it is your responsibility to have the outlet and wiring changed to the correct type.

⚠ WARNING *DO NOT cut off the third (grounding) prong.*







CONTROL PANEL



1. POWER indicator: When the unit is first connected, the indicator flashes slowly. It lights up when the unit is turned on, and goes out when the unit is turned off.
2. Continue indicator: Lights up when the unit is in CONTINUOUS DEHUMIDIFYING mode.
3. Full indicator: Lights up when the bucket is full, and the unit stops operating. The bucket must be emptied.
4. Turbo indicator: Lights up when the  button is pressed, and the fan speed is high.
5. Normal indicator: Lights up when the  button is pressed, and the fan speed is low.
6.  Button: The Power indicator blinks slowly when the unit is first plugged in. Press the button once and the unit will directly go into DEHUMIDIFYING operation with the original factory humidity setting (60% RH). Press the  button again, and the unit will stop operation.

Features (Continued)

7.  Button: When the unit is operating, press the  button to start CONTINUOUS DEHUMIDIFYING mode.
8. Humidity  Button: When the unit is operating, press this button to increase the humidity setting. The range of adjustment is from 35% RH to 80% RH.
9. Humidity  Button: When the unit is operating, press this button to decrease the humidity setting. The range of adjustment is from 80% RH to 35% RH.
10.  Button: When the unit is operating, press this button to set the fan speed to high. The Turbo indicator lights up.
11.  Button: When the unit is operating, press this button to set the fan speed to low. The Normal indicator lights up.

Installation

To assure efficient dehumidification, close all windows and doors in the area where the dehumidifier is to operate.

Once you have assembled your dehumidifier and installed it in an appropriate location, plug the cord into a properly grounded outlet.

Install the mobile dehumidifier in a flat and spacious location where the air outlets will not be covered up. Do not install underneath desks or inside cupboards as this will restrict the air flow.

Maintain a clearance of at least 20 cm from the front and rear to maintain correct air-flow of unit.



Operation

POWER INDICATOR

Press the "Power" button to activate the unit. The Power "On" indicator lights up. The unit is pre-set to maintain a 60% relative humidity level.

CONTAINER FULL INDICATOR

An automatic overflow switch and Container "Full" indicator light are provided to turn the dehumidifier off before the container overflows. When the indicator light on the control panel glows, the water container must be emptied. If the light remains on and the dehumidifier does not begin to operate make sure the float is attached to the water container.

⚠ WARNING *This water is not suitable for drinking.*

SET HUMIDITY DISPLAY

If the "Set Humidity" level is lower than the "Room" humidity level: the compressor will start up and the unit will start dehumidification. If the "Set Humidity" level is higher than the "Room" level: the unit will not dehumidify.

After operating several days at the default setting, with doors and windows closed, you may adjust the "Set Humidity" to a slightly lower percent (drier air) or higher percent (moist air). If you would like to adjust the "Set Humidity" humidity level, press the " " or " " buttons to adjust the humidistat in 5% increments between 35% and 80%.

ROOM HUMIDITY/TEMPERATURE DISPLAY

The "Room" display will display either the relative humidity or temperature of the room. The default setting is room humidity. To display the temperature of the room press the "Humidity/ Temperature" button. Press it again to go back to the humidity level.



OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

OPERATING CONDITIONS

- This unit is designed to operate with a working environment between 55°F (13°C) and 95°F (35°C).
- If the unit has been switched off and needs to be switched on again quickly, allow approximately three minutes for the correct operation to resume.
- Do not connect the dehumidifier to a multiple socket outlet, which is also being used for other electrical appliances.
- Select a suitable location, making sure you have easy access to an electrical outlet.
- Plug the unit into a 115 V~60 Hz electrical outlet with earth connection.
- Make sure the water tank is correctly fitted, otherwise the unit will not operate properly.

TURNING THE UNIT "ON" OR "OFF"

1. Plug the cord into an outlet with the proper power requirement. The computer system of the unit will do a

self-check. If it is normal, the Power indicator flashes at 0.5 Hz. Press the **⏻** button and the unit will start operating in DEHUMIDIFYING mode with 60% humidity setting. Press the Humidity **⊕** or **⊖** buttons to change the humidity setting.

2. Press the **⏻** button to start continuous dehumidifying mode. In this mode, the Humidity **⊕** and **⊖** buttons are disabled.
3. Press the **⏻** button to turn off the unit. (You do not need to unplug the power cord except when the unit will not be in use for a long period of time.)

WATER BUCKET

- Water will drain into the bucket. When the bucket is full and the unit stops operating, the "Full" indicator light will flash.
- Do not remove the water bucket when the machine is still working. This might cause some water to drip.
- To empty the water bucket, remove the bucket as shown. Empty the water and replace the bucket back in the unit. Ensure the components of the water bucket are correctly positioned.
- The machine will restart when the bucket is restored to its correct position.

1. Drag out the bucket a little.



2. Hold the two sides of the bucket with even strength, and pull it out from the unit.



3. Pour the water out.



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Operation (Continued)

CONTINUOUS DRAINAGE

- On the rear of the unit, remove the plastic cover carefully (see picture below).
- Remove the water tank first, then push the hose onto the connector located inside of the hole.
- The hose should go down smoothly without bends or kinks.
- Place the end of the hose into a suitable drainage facility.





PERMANENT DRAIN INSTALLATION (OPTIONAL):

The condensate water can be removed directly from the unit to a drain through a garden hose with the included adapter.

1. Turn the power off before beginning work.
2. Use a screwdriver to remove the knock-out at the back of the unit.
3. Slide the garden hose adapter (supplied) over the condensate drain through the knock-out hole.
4. Connect the garden hose to the adapter.
5. The garden hose should lead to a floor drain or other appropriate drain source. The garden hose should have no inclines or sharp bends.

Maintenance

FILTER CLEANING

Cleaning is recommended monthly or as conditions require.

1. Turn the power off.
2. Use a vacuum cleaner attachment or brush to clean the front grille.
3. Remove the filter.
4. To clean the filter, wash in warm, soapy water, rinse and shake dry. Proper use and care of your dehumidifier will help ensure longer life of the unit. It is recommended to annually inspect and clean the coils and condensate water passages. Expense of annual inspection is the consumers' responsibility.







⚠ WARNING *Never operate the unit without a filter.*

IMPORTANT: Be sure to unplug the unit before cleaning.

- Do not use gasoline, thinners or other chemical agents to clean the unit as this may damage the unit.
- Do not wash the unit directly under a tap or hose. The electrical components inside may be damaged and the unit may become unsafe as a result.

AIR FILTER

Clean the air filter at least once every two weeks to prevent impaired performance of the unit.

REMOVAL

Pull the air filter out as shown (Figure 15).

CLEANING

Wash the air filter with clean water, and then carefully dry.

REPLACEMENT

Install the cleaned filter following Figure 17.

UNIT ENCLOSURE

Use a soft, clean cloth to wipe the surface. Do not use water as this may cause an electrical fault or shock hazard.

Maintenance (Continued)

WATER TANK

Wash the tank using warm water (about 104°F [40°C]) with neutral detergent. Rinse and allow to dry. Replace tank when dry.

WIRING EAR

Wind the excess cord onto the wiring ear.



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


Figure 19 – Repair Parts Illustration for Model 5EAJ7




Figure 20 – Repair Parts Illustration for 5EAJ8 and 5EAJ9
